

Learn How to Draw: Eyes, Nose, Mouth, and Ears

In the previous 'Learn How to Draw' articles, Linda provided information about your drawing materials and basics on how to draw the human head. She now takes you deeper in this tutorial, as you learn how to draw the features that belong on that head including the eyes, nose, mouth, and ears. As usual, you'll receive a homework assignment at the end of the article.

The Features on the Human Head

You learned how to shape the human head in the previous article, and you sketched in eye, nose, mouth, and ear placement while you sketched. This tutorial will take you a bit deeper into the features included in the human head, and you will learn how to make those features realistic. But, first – a brief overview with a few more tips on how the human head works (in most cases!)



If you remember the head shown above from the previous article, you remember that I drew an oval around that head and lines to show placement for the eyes, nose, mouth, and ears. This tutorial will take you further, as you'll begin to visualize the base for the human head, or the skull, and how that base shapes the human head's features.



One of the few tricks to shaping the human head includes the placement of the eyes according to the mouth. In the photo to the left above, I drew lines to show how the corners of the mouth line up with the
