About Feed Genie ASP

Get your favorite feeds as Data Sources directly in Dreamweaver! Now you can add the feed fields directly from the Data bindings panel to your page and any tag attributes as dynamic data! Use Feed Genie Repeater to display all the feed entries exactly the way you want. Choose from the many supplied standard feeds like Flickr, YouTube, Twitter, Facebook, and Picasa but customize them with your own filters!

As the Feed Genie creates Dreamweaver Data Bindings, you can also use it in combination with any other standard Dreamweaver extension as well as the DMXzone extensions such as HTML5 Image Enhancer, DMXzone Lightbox and many others. You can even add a cool paging to the Feed Genie records with the DMXzone Paginator!




Features in Detail

 Many standard feeds supplied - Choose from the many feed such as: Flickr, YouTube, Facebook, Twitter, Last.FM, WordPress and Picasa.






• **Fully Parameterized Feeds** - For each chosen feed an interface with feed specific options is shown, so you can directly enter the needed feed parameters! When you want to display the Picasa photos for a specific album, you can just enter the album name in the appropriate field.





• **Custom Feed Data Sources** - Next to the standard feed data fields you can choose from, you get, depending on the choosen field type, additional custom data source fields in the data binding panel! So when you choose a Picasa Photo feed you can also use fields like additional EXIF information or various user and album values.






Custom feeds – If your feed is not on the list you can always enter your feed URL directly.






• Feeds as Data Sources - Add your favorite feeds as data sources directly in Dreamweaver.






• Feed Fields - Add feed fields directly from the Data Bindings panel.






• Tag attributes - Add any tag attributes as dynamic data.





• Feed Genie Repeater - Use Repeat region to display all feed entries the way you want.





• **Use Feed Genie ASP with other extensions** - You can combine it with any standard Dreamweaver extension as well as the DMXzone extensions like HTML5 Slideshow, HTML5 Image Enhancer, and many others.






• Cacheable Feeds - the feeds are automatically cached when fetched so when requested again the cached version is served directly and the user gets an instant response as well your server load stays low. You can fully control the cache time with the supplied option.



• Sorting option – You can sort your feeds by author, title, link, description, and many others.




• Search engine friendly - The feeds are generated server side and can be well indexed.





• Great Dreamweaver Integration - Interactive dialog in Dreamweaver with all the options you'll need.

Open the .mxp file (the extension manager should start-up) and install the extension.




Reference: Feed Types




Flickr - Friends' Photostream






Flickr - Public Feed


















The Basics: Displaying Picassa Featured feed thumbnails, which open full size within a Lightbox

In this tutorial we will show you how to display a Picassa Featured feed thumbnails using <u>Feed Genie ASP</u> and open the full size images within <u>DMXzone Lightbox</u>.




How to do it

1. **Define your site in Dreamweaver and create a new page** - We've already added a background to our page.





2. Applying the behavior – Under the Server Behavior tab, click the Add new item button (1). Click the DMXzone Menu (2) and select the Feed Genie ASP menu item (3).






The Feed Genie ASP dialog opens:






3. Adding feeds – Add a Name for your feed (1), select the Picassa – Featured Photos item (2) from the dropdown menu and test (3) your feed.






4. **Testing Feeds** – Once you've added your feed, when clicking the test button a new window opens. In our case it seems our feeds are ok.






5. Editing feeds options – Choose the thumbnail size (1), select the original image size (2), set max results per page (3) and sort feeds by Published Date (4) and select Descending option (5).






6. Adding thumbnails - From the Insert menu (1) select the Image menu item (2).






• The Select Image Source window opens, where we will select the data source radio button (1) and choose thumbnail (2).






7. Applying the Feed Genie Repeater – Click on the image (1) and select Feed Genie Repeater (5) from the Feed Genie menu (4) under the Server Behavior tab (2).






8. **Selecting records** – For this tutorial we choose **all records** to be shown on our page. Now, our Feed Genie Repeater is added to our image.






9. Adding DMXzone Lightbox - Click on the image (1) and select the Lightbox link (2).




The **DMXzone Lightbox Link** window opens, click the **browse button**.






10. Customizing the Lightbox - Select the Data Source radio button (1) and the Image URL item (2).






11. Adding titles – We will set up the titles of Picasa images to be used as DMXzone Lightbox titles. Select the <a> tag from the Properties inspector (1), choose the Plain Description item (2), the a.title option from the dropdown menu (3) and click the Bind button (4).





Now, save your work and preview the result in a browser.






Advanced: Dividing Picassa Image Thumbnails into pages using DMXzone Paginator ASP.




How to do it

1. Add the Picassa feed to your page (view previous tutorial) where the images are 18 per page (from the Feed Genie Repeater).






2. Applying DMXzone Paginator – From the Server Behaviors tab, click Add new item (1), choose the DMXzone Paginator ASP (3) under the DMXzone menu (2).






The **DMXzone Paginator ASP window** opens.






3. Choosing Style – For our tutorial we'll choose the black style. When you're done click OK.





Now you can save your work and preview the result in a browser.
