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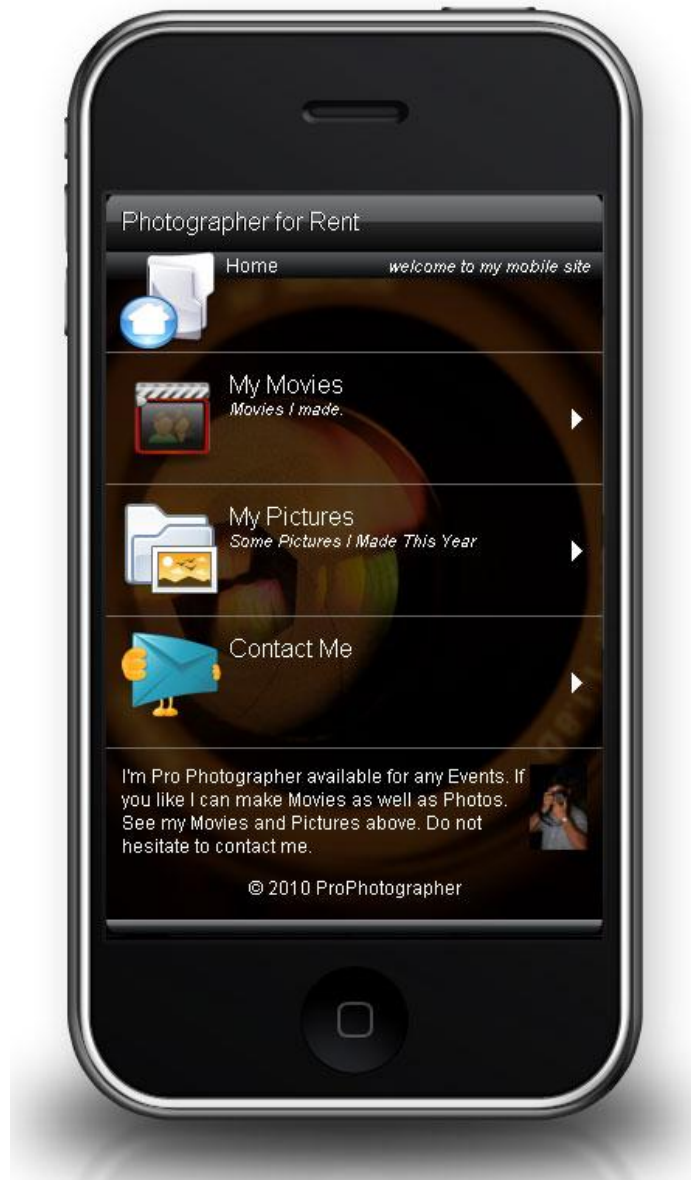


About Sliding Menu

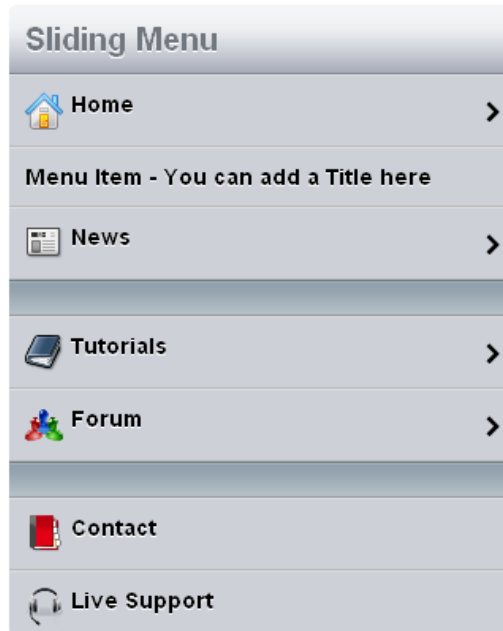

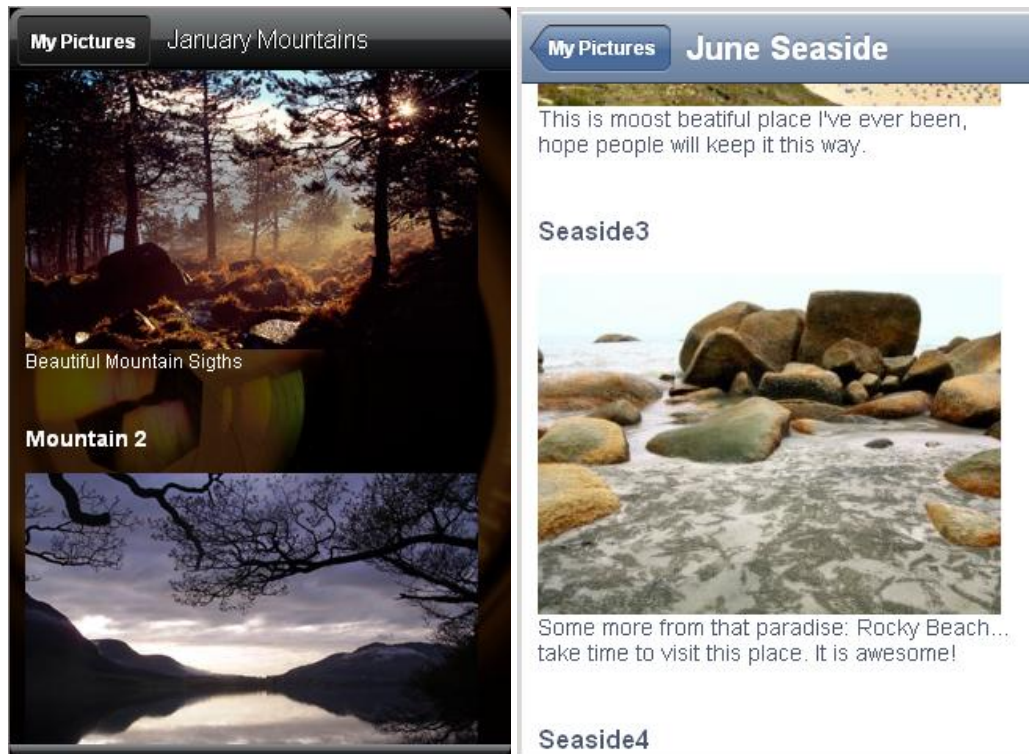

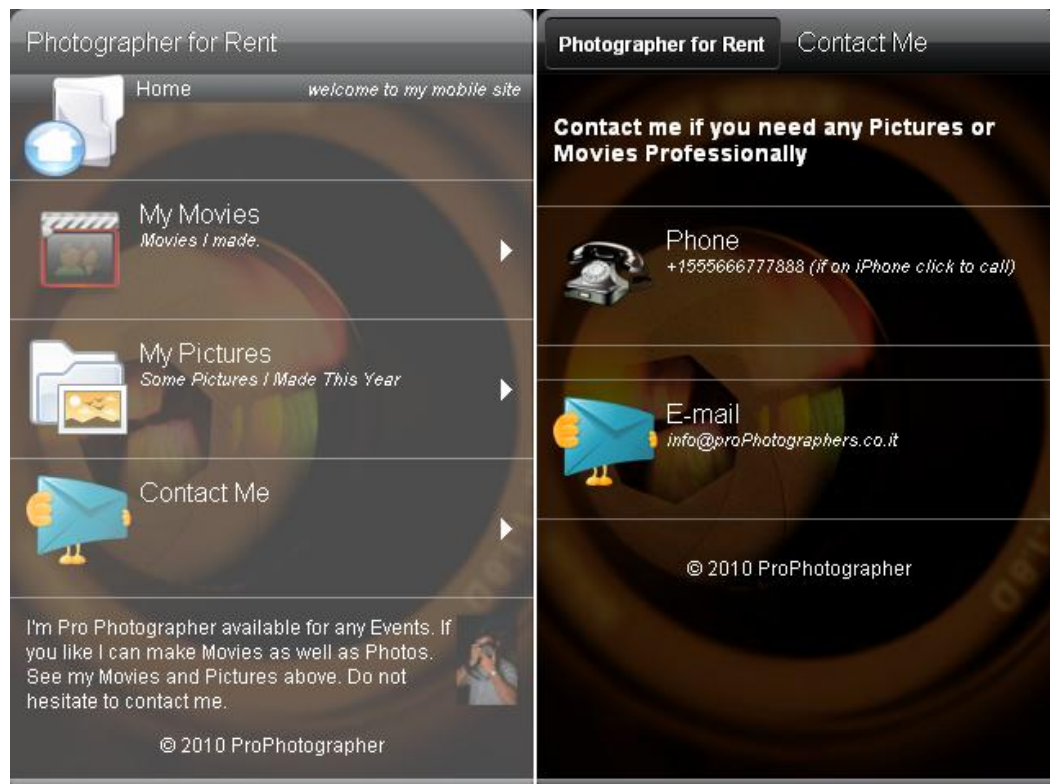

- **Rich Type Links** – Use rich type links for extra native functionality such as calling a phone number, showing a Google Map location, sending sms and playing YouTube videos.
 - **YouTube video** - The YouTube URL scheme is used to launch the YouTube application or connect to the YouTube website to play the specified video.





- **Calling Phone** - Tapping a telephone link on a webpage displays an alert asking if the user really wants to dial the phone number and initiates dialing if the user accepts.




- **Building Articles** – you can use the Menu Items with Descriptions in order to build articles.

 **Animals**
Animals are a major group of mostly multicellular, eukaryotic organisms of the kingdom Animalia or Metazoa. Their body plan eventually becomes fixed as they develop, although some undergo a process of metamorphosis later on in their life. Most animals are motile, meaning they can move spontaneously and independently. All animals are also heterotrophs, meaning they must ingest other organisms for sustenance.

 **Fish**
A fish is any aquatic vertebrate animal that is covered with scales, and equipped with two sets of paired fins and several unpaired fins. Most fish are "cold-blooded", or ectothermic, allowing their body temperatures to vary as ambient temperatures change. Fish are abundant in most bodies of water. They can be found in nearly all aquatic environments, from high mountain streams (e.g., char and gudgeon) to the abyssal and even hadal depths of the deepest oceans (e.g., gulpers and anglerfish). At 31,500 species, fish exhibit greater species diversity than any other class of vertebrates.

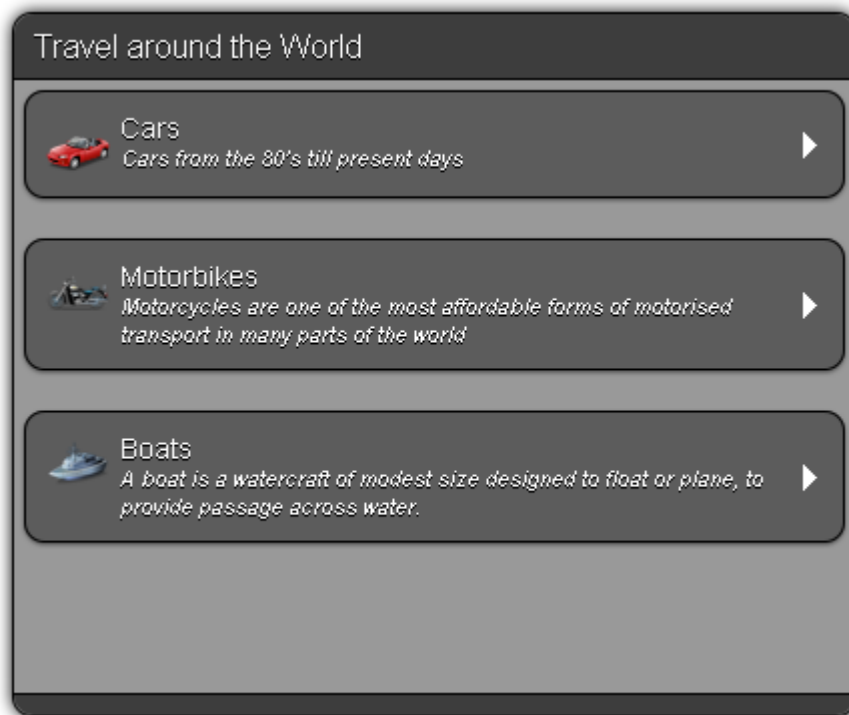
- **Back Button** – Use Menu Item as title for the back button on its sub menus.

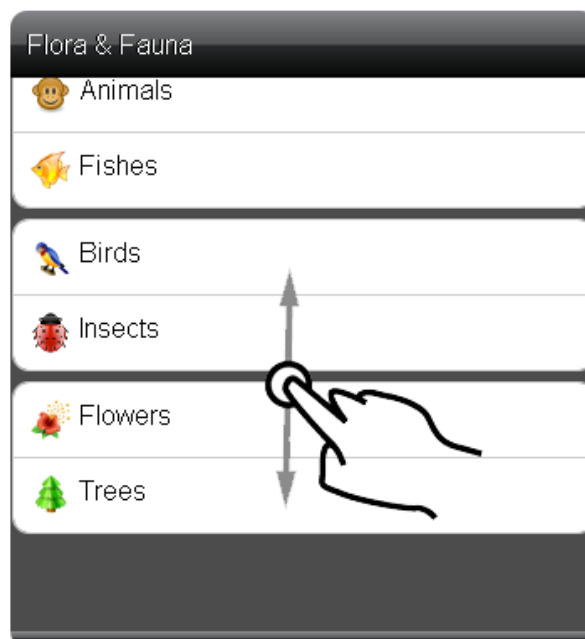

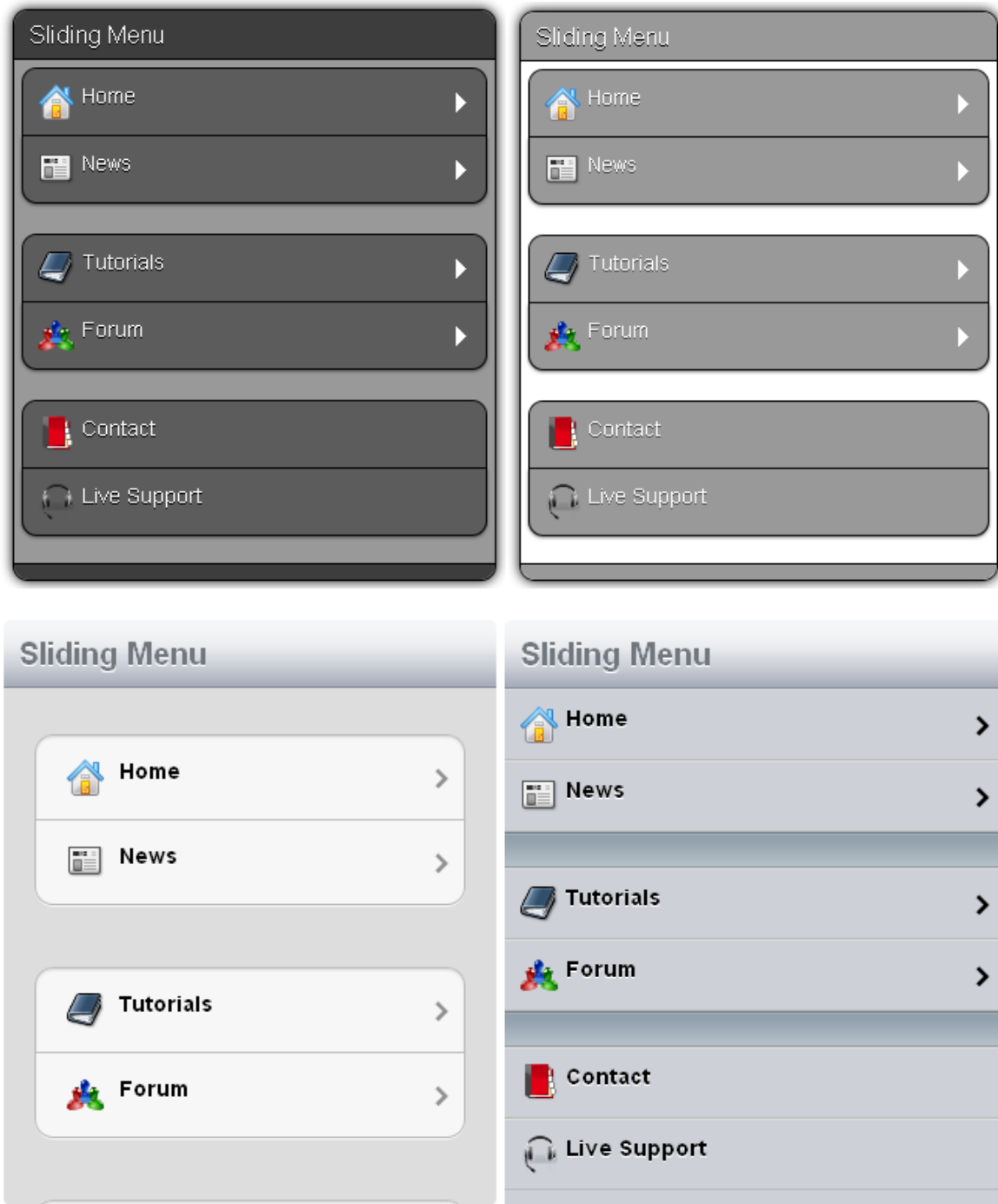
- **Titles and Descriptions** – Use description for your titles in order to give more information about the sub menu

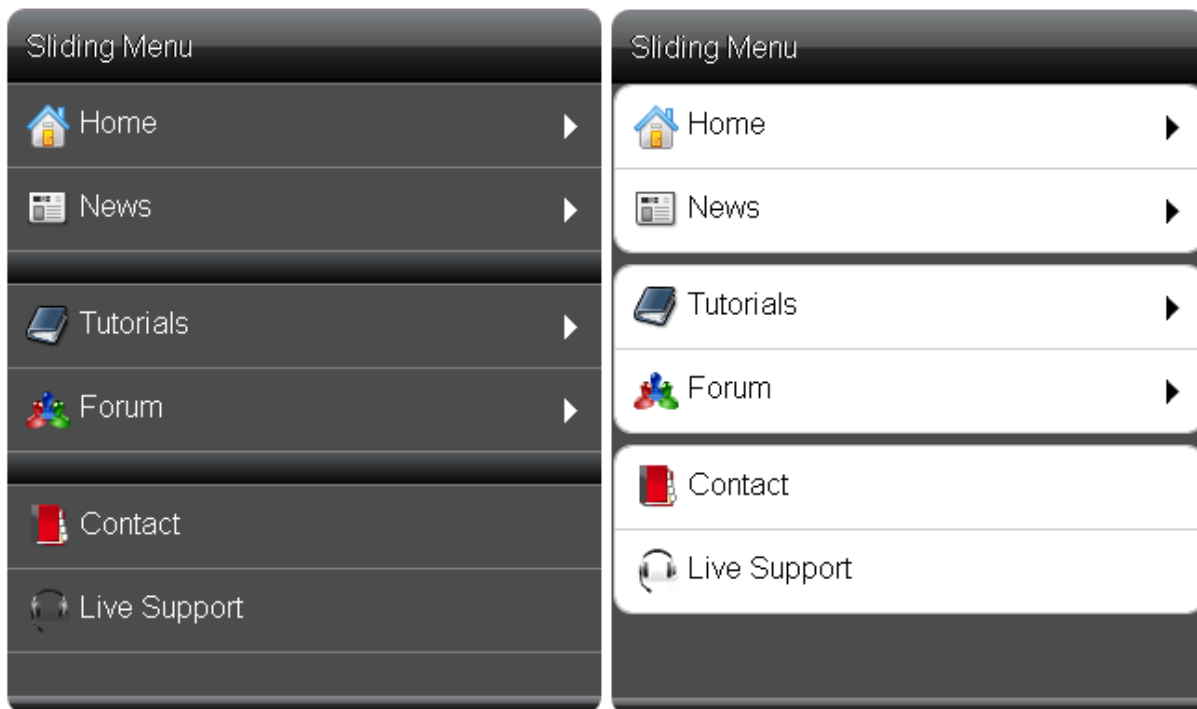
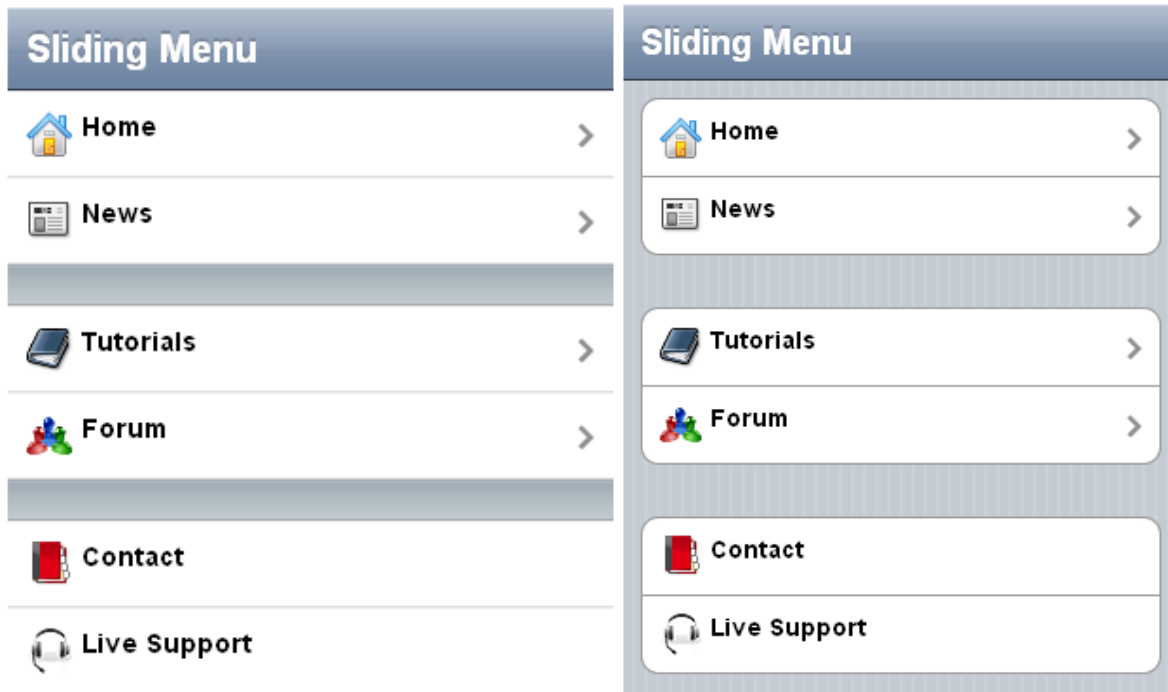


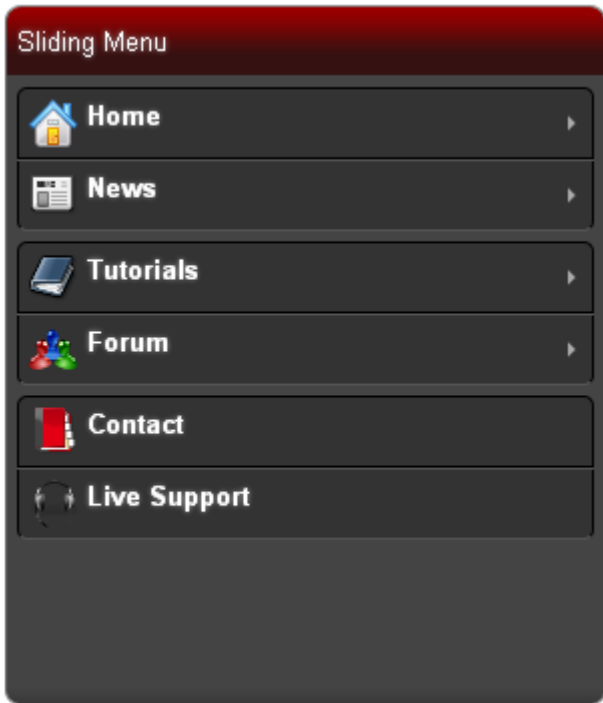
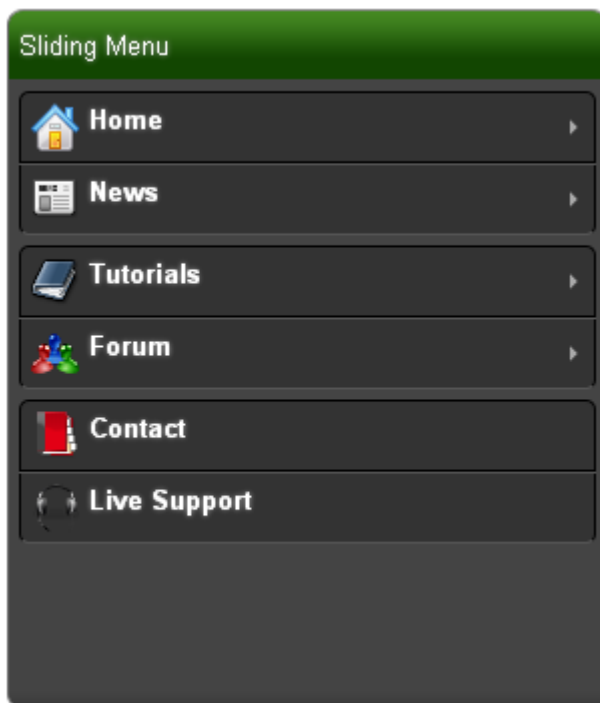
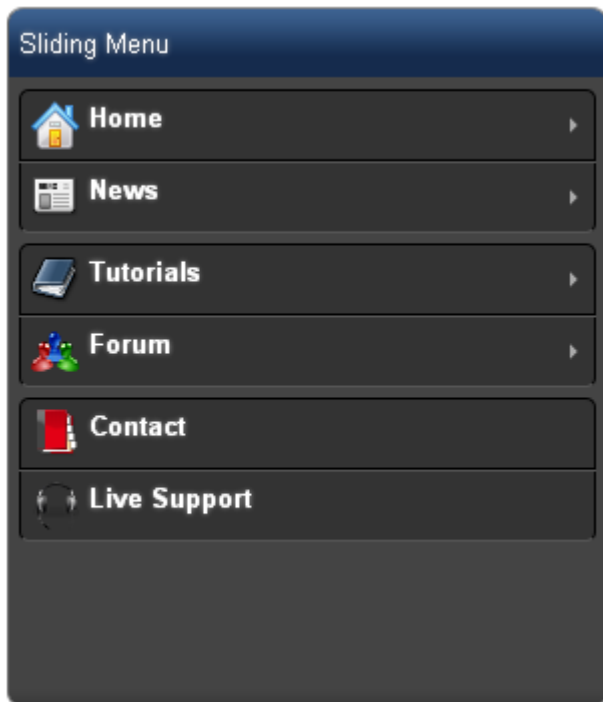
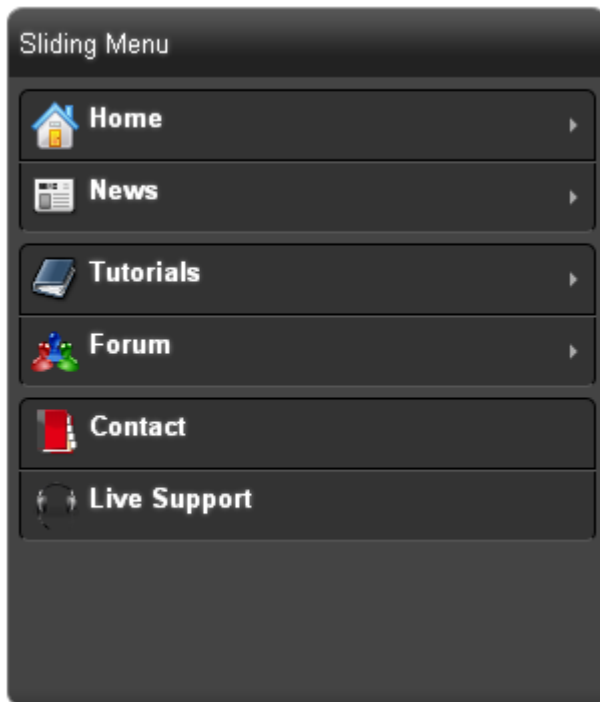
- **Auto Shorten Back Button Titles and Menu Titles** – With ellipsis both the back button and the menu titles always fit nicely

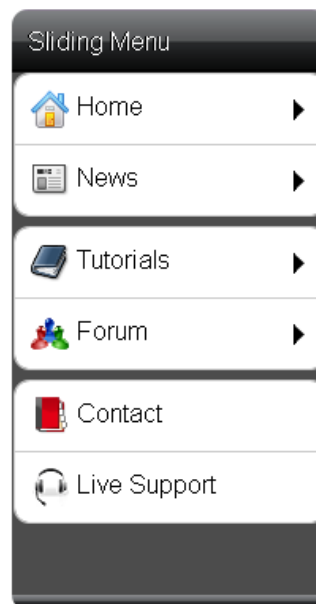




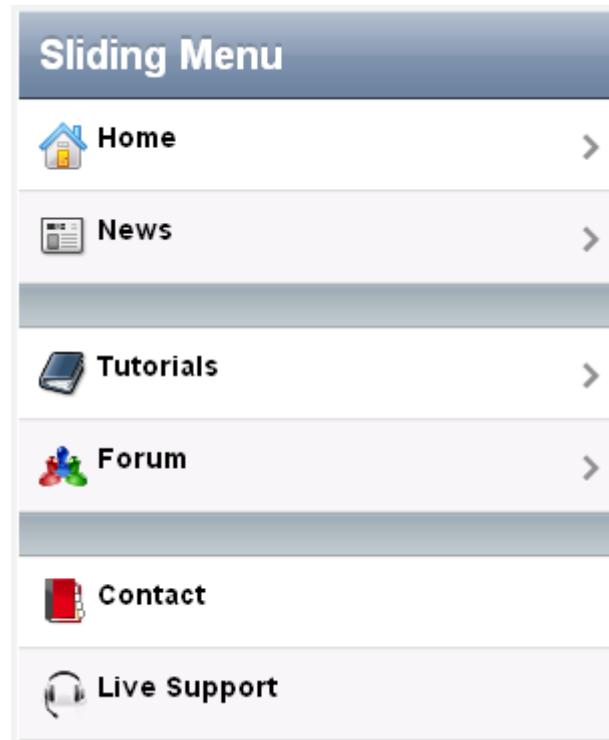




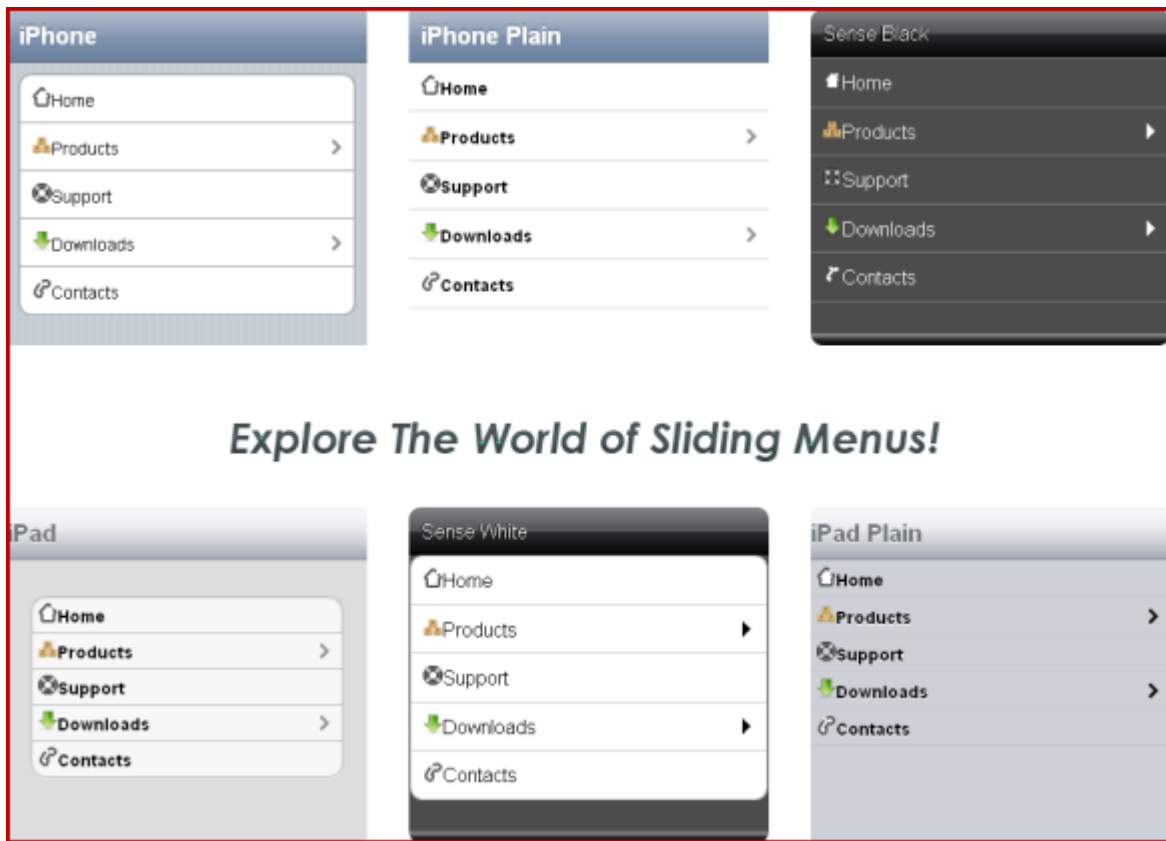
- **Add custom icon for each menu item** – You can add design icons to your menus and style them top, right or left, so that you can create stunning menus on your web site.



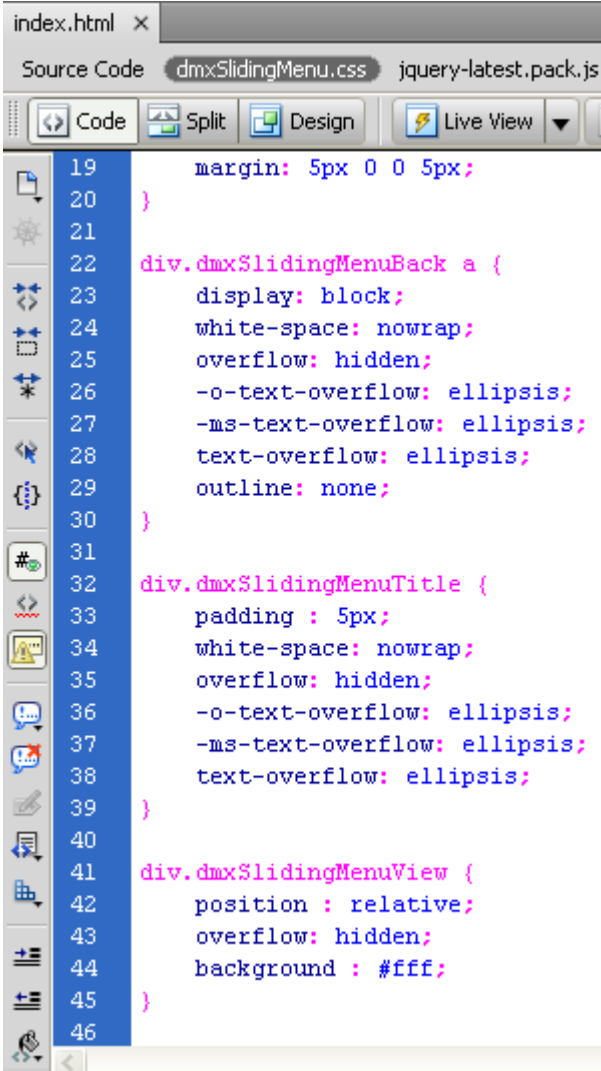

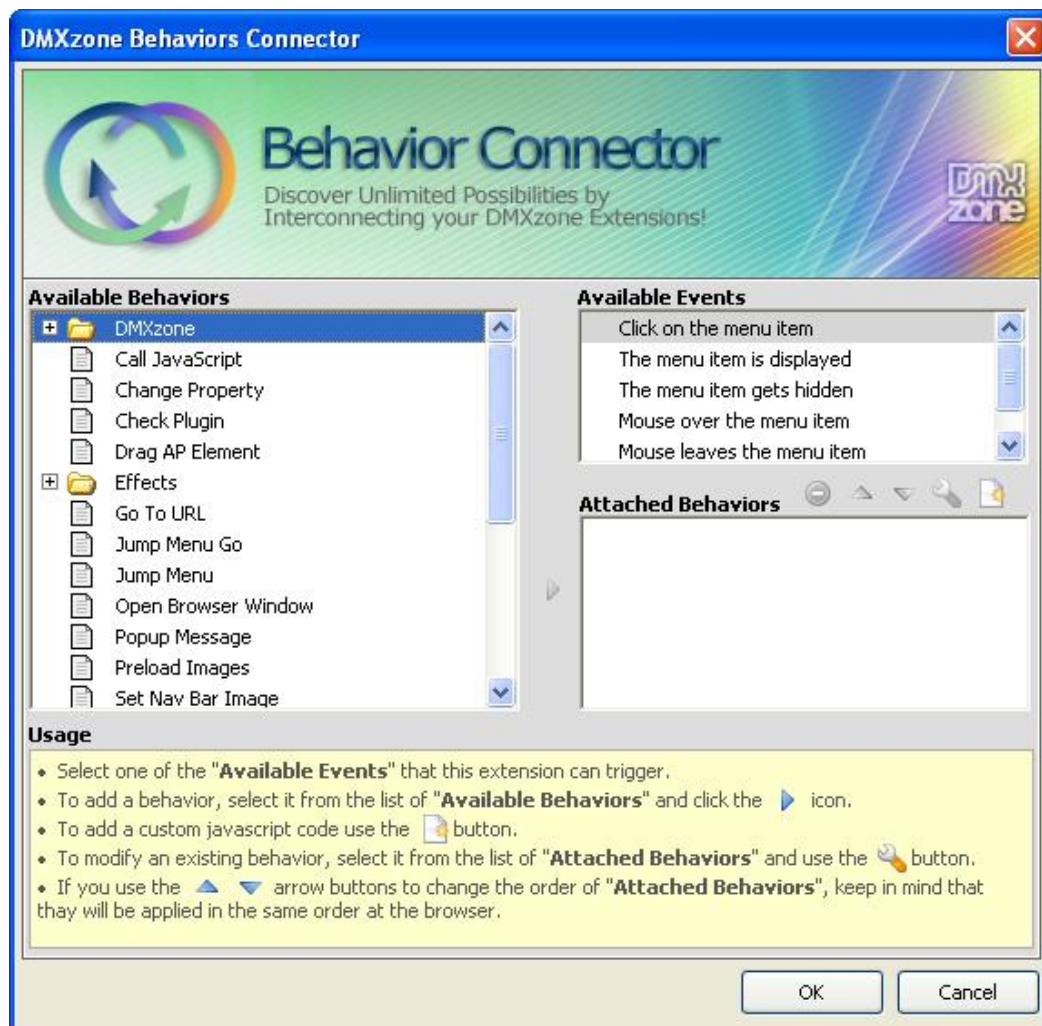
- **Great Dreamweaver Integration** - Interactive dialog in Dreamweaver with all the options you'll need.

Reference: iPhone and Android Intents

Android

The list below shows the intents that your application can send, to invoke Google applications on Android devices in certain ways. For each action/uri pair, the table describes how the receiving Google application handles the intent.

- **Browser** - Open a browser window to the URL specified. (*http://web_address, https://web_address*)
 - Opens the file at the location on the device in the browser (" (empty string), *http://web_address, https://web_address*)
- **Dialer** - Calls the entered phone number. (*tel: phone_number*)
 - Dials (but does not actually initiate the call) the number given (or the stored voicemail on the phone). Telephone number normalization described for CALL applies to DIAL as well. (*tel:phone_number voicemail:*)
- **Google Maps** - Opens the Maps application to the given location or query. The Geo URI scheme (not fully supported) is currently under development. (*geo:latitude,longitude, geo:latitude,longitude?z=zoom, geo:0,0?q=my+street+address, geo:0,0?q=business+near+city*)
- **Google Overview** - Opens the Street View application to the given location. The URI scheme is based on the syntax used for Street View panorama information in Google Maps URLs. (*google.streetview:cbll=lat,lng&cbp=1,yaw,,pitch,zoom&mz=mapZoom*)

iPhone

Native iOS applications and web applications running in Safari on any platform can use these schemes to integrate with system applications and provide a more seamless experience for the user.

- **Mail** - The *mailto* scheme is used to launch the Mail application and open the email compose sheet. When specifying a *mailto* URL, you must provide the target email address. The following examples show strings formatted for Safari and for native iPhone applications. (<mailto:foo@example.com?cc=bar@example.com&subject=Greetings%20from%20Cupertino!&body=Wish%20you%20were%20here!>)
- **Phone** - The *tel* URL scheme is used to launch the Phone application and initiate dialing of the specified phone number. Tapping a telephone link on a webpage displays an alert asking if the user really wants to dial the phone number and initiates dialing if the user accepts. In a native application, opening a URL with the *tel* scheme initiates dialing without further prompting from the user. (<tel:1-408-555-5555>)
- **SMS** - The *sms* scheme is used to launch the Text application. The format for URLs of this type is "sms:<phone>", where <phone> is an optional parameter that specifies the target phone number of the SMS message. This parameter can contain the digits 0 through 9 and the plus (+), hyphen (-), and period (.) characters. The URL string must not include any message text or other information. (*sms:1-*

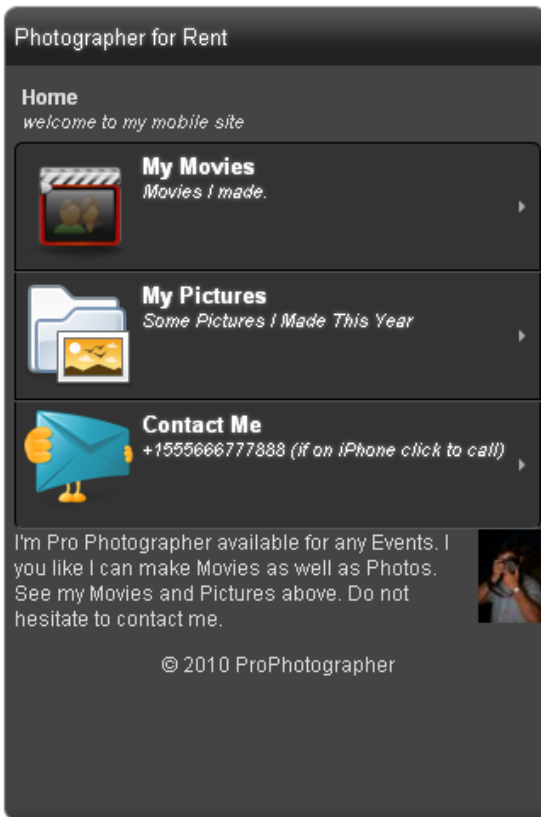

- **Google Maps** - The *maps* URL scheme is used to show geographical locations and to generate driving directions between two points. If your application includes address or location information, you can use map links to forward that information to the Maps application on iOS and the Google Maps website on other platforms.

- **YouTube** - The YouTube URL scheme is used to launch the YouTube application or connect to the YouTube website to play the specified video. If your application links to YouTube content, you can use this scheme to play videos from your application.
(http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=VIDEO_IDENTIFIER)
- **iTunes** - The iTunes URL scheme is used to link to content on the iTunes Music Store. The iTunes URL format is complicated to construct, so you create it using an online tool called iTunes Link Maker. The tool allows you to select a country destination and media type, and then search by song, album, or artist. After you select the item you want to link to, it generates the corresponding URL.

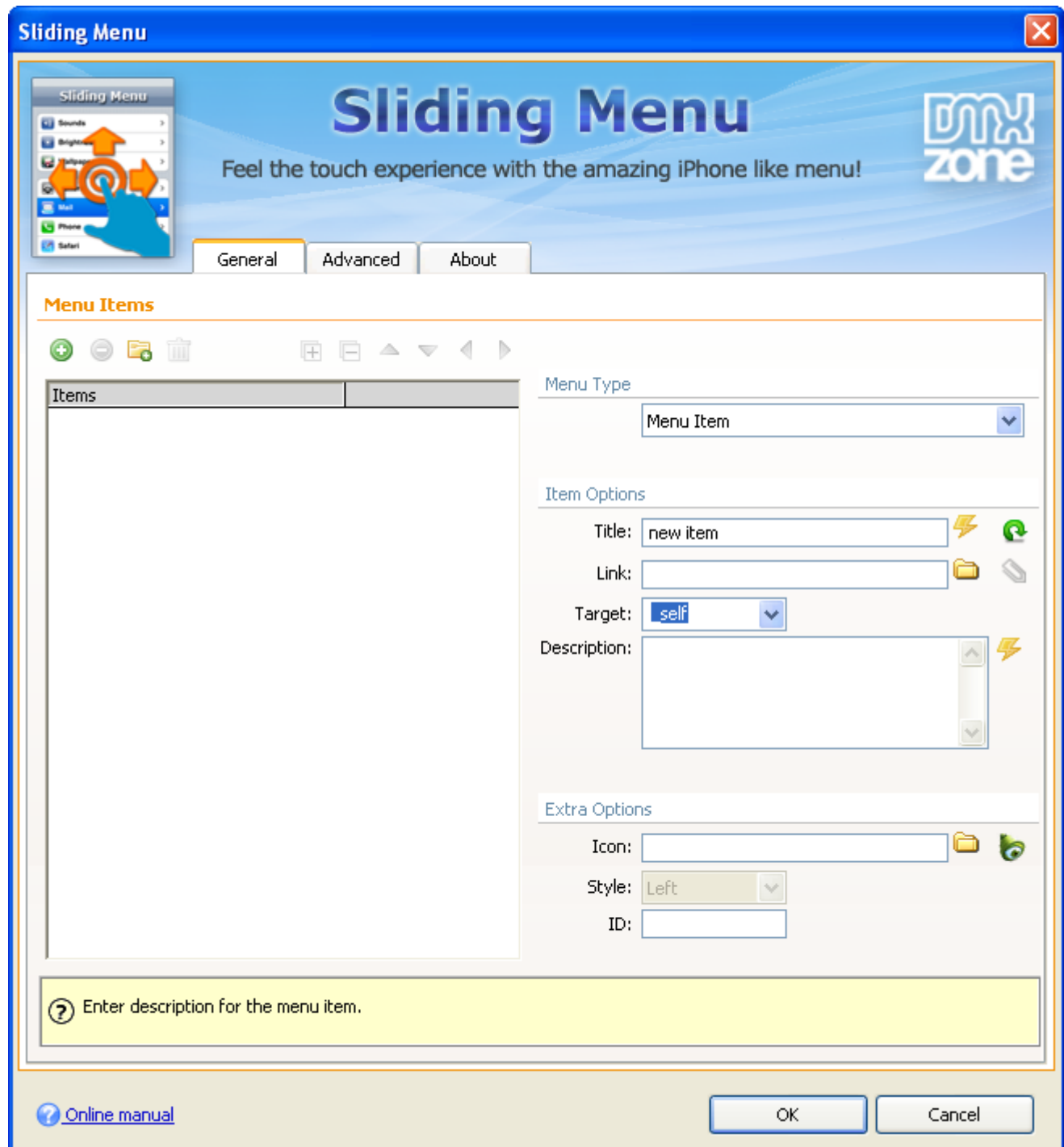


How to do it

1. Define your site in Dreamweaver and create a new page.
2. Applying the extension – Choose the  icon from the DMXzone object bar to apply the extension.



The **Sliding Menu** dialog appears:



3. **Adding menus** – Click the **Add New Menu Item** button to add a menu item. **(1)** Add a **title** to it and select **Menu Label** from the **Menu Type** dropdown menu. **(2)** You can also add some description if you want. **(3)**

You can also choose an icon from the **Icon Finder extension** (free extension available for download at DMXzone.com).

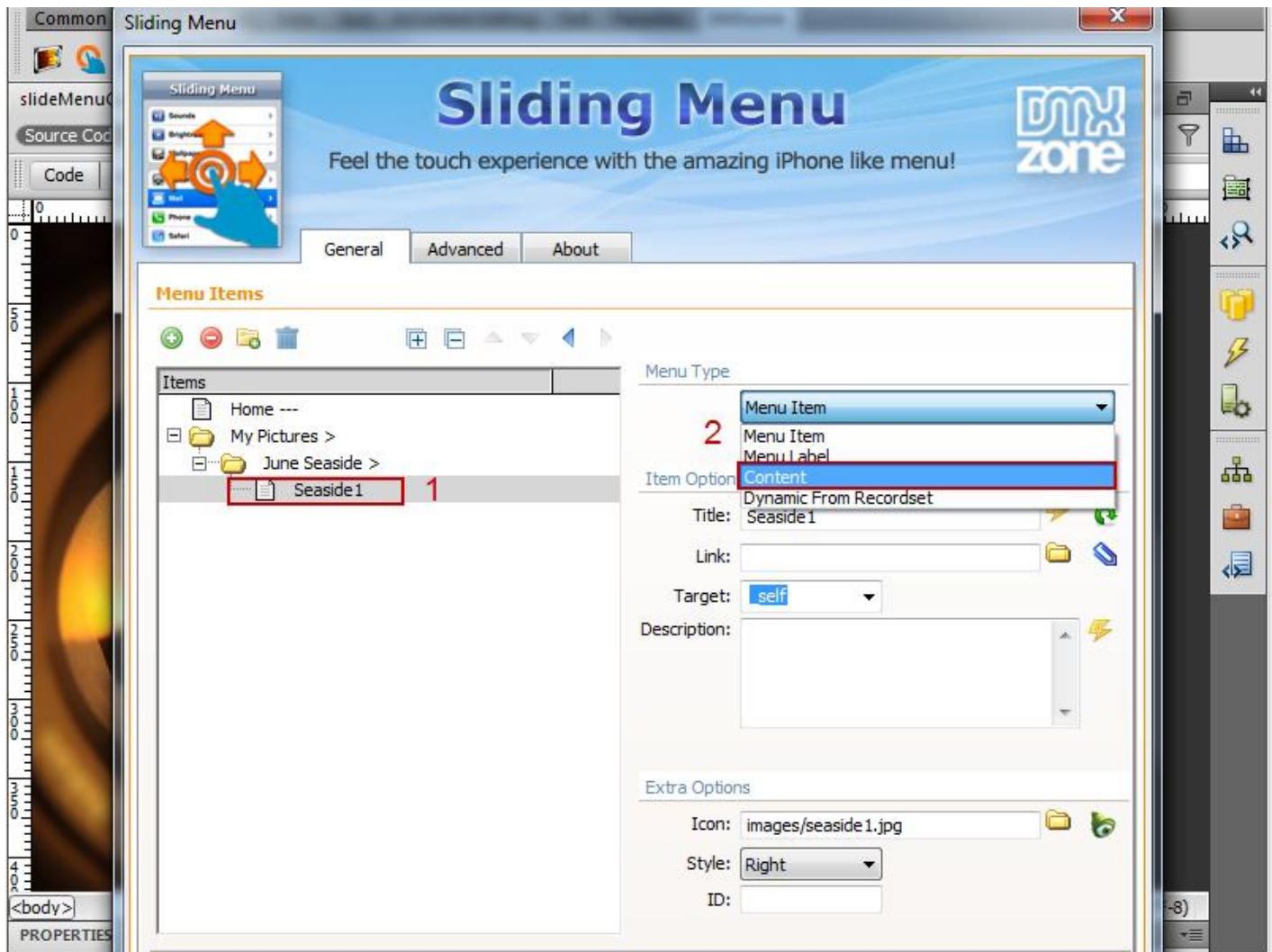
- We'll set our **Content page** as a **Child Menu** of My Pictures menu item. Click the **Move Menu Right** button.

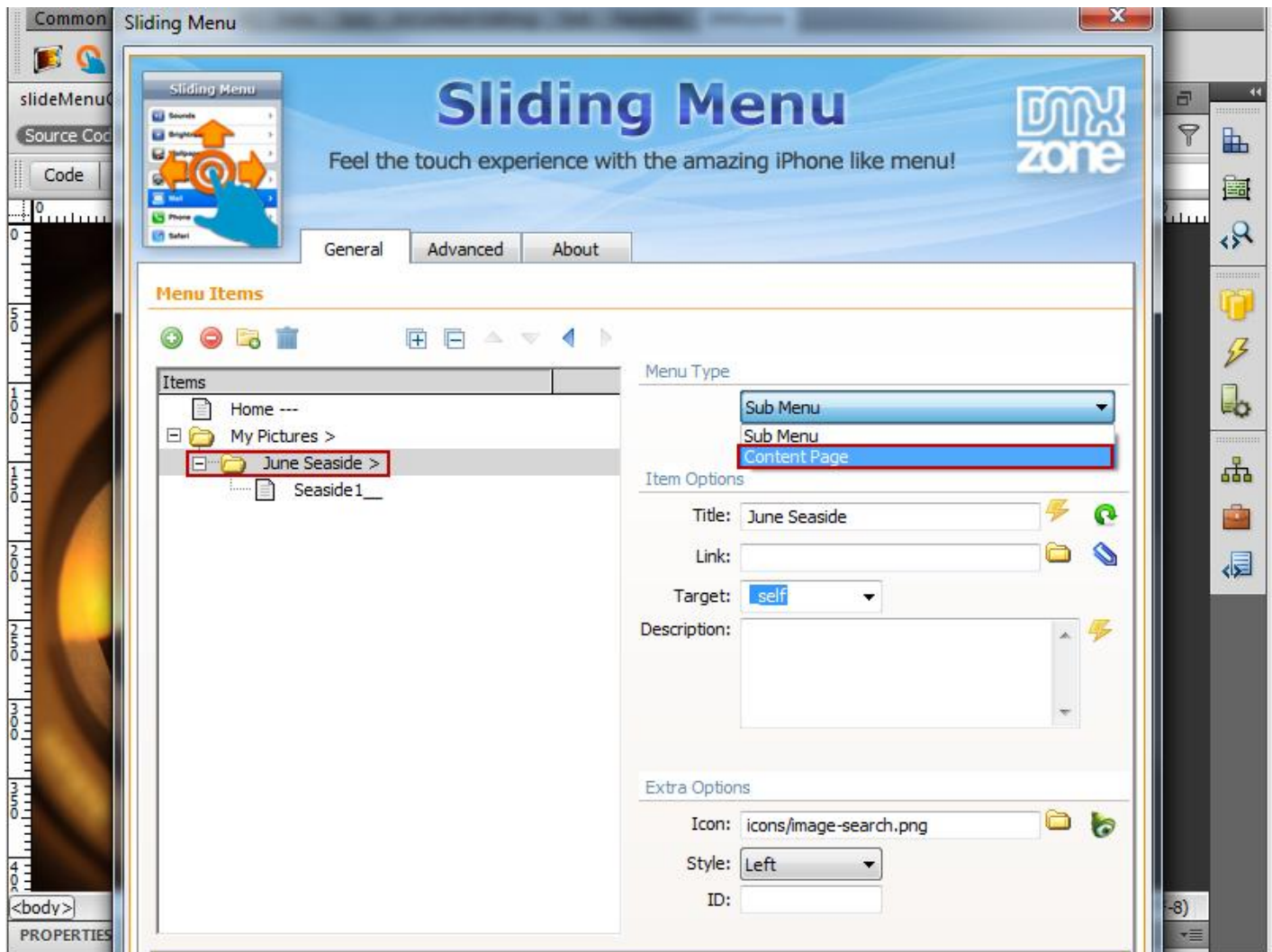
6. After we've created a Content Page we're going to add some content to it - We're going to add a new item (1) and fill the Description field with text content (2). You can also style the text with standard HTML attributes. We'll also add a picture to from the Browse for File button (3) and add it as a Child item to the Content Page (4).

- After that we'll make its parent menu item a **Content Page**.




8. Now, you can save your work and preview the result in a browser!

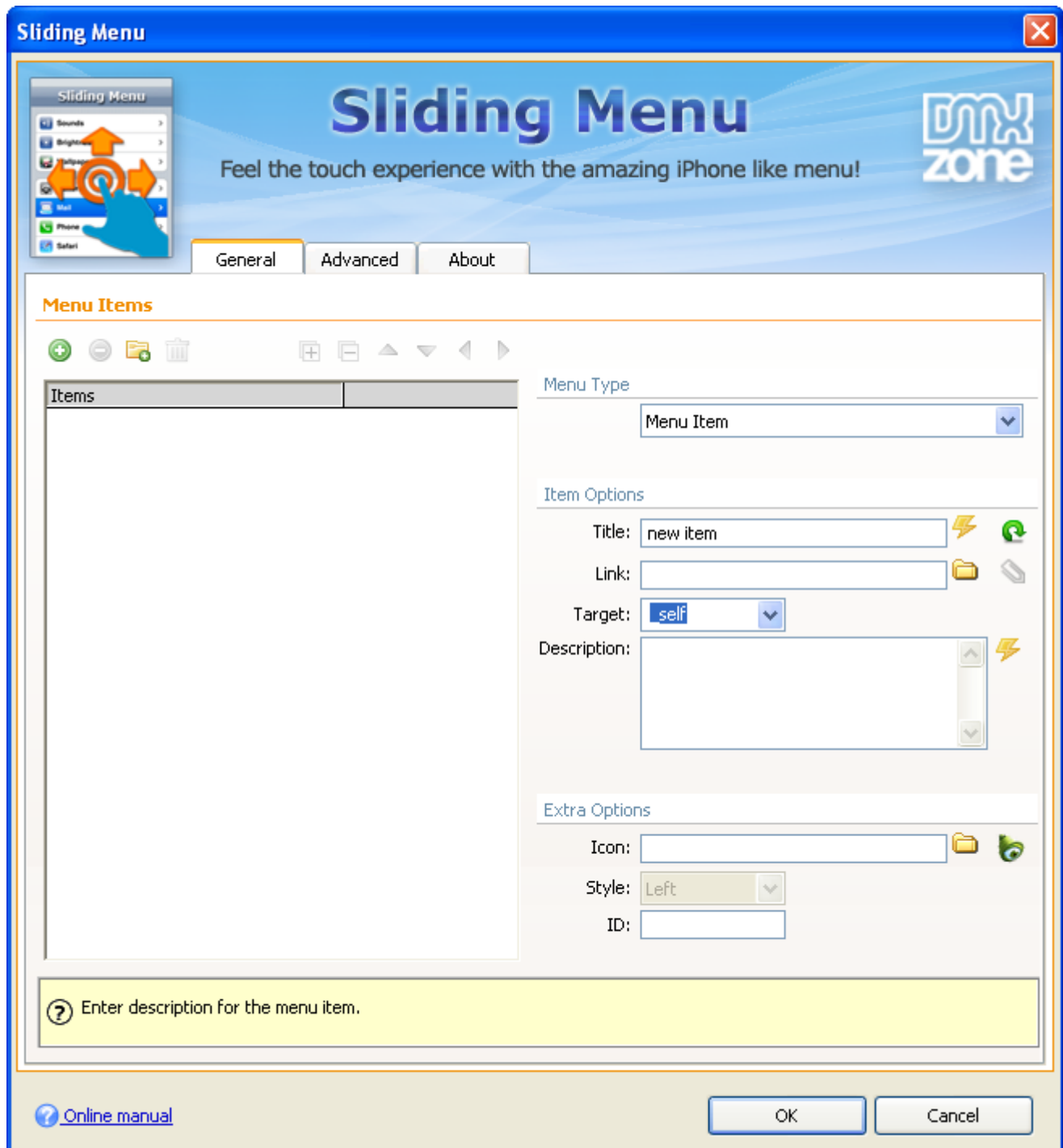

How to do it

1. **Define your site in Dreamweaver and create a new page.**
2. **Creating a new file in your already defined site** - You need to set the site with a server type (PHP, ASP-VB, ASP-JS etc.) and create a database that will serve as a source for your menu items.
3. **Applying the extension** – Choose the  icon from the DMXzone object bar to apply the extension.

4. **Adding menu** - Add new menu item and choose from **Menu Type - Dynamic from Recordset**.

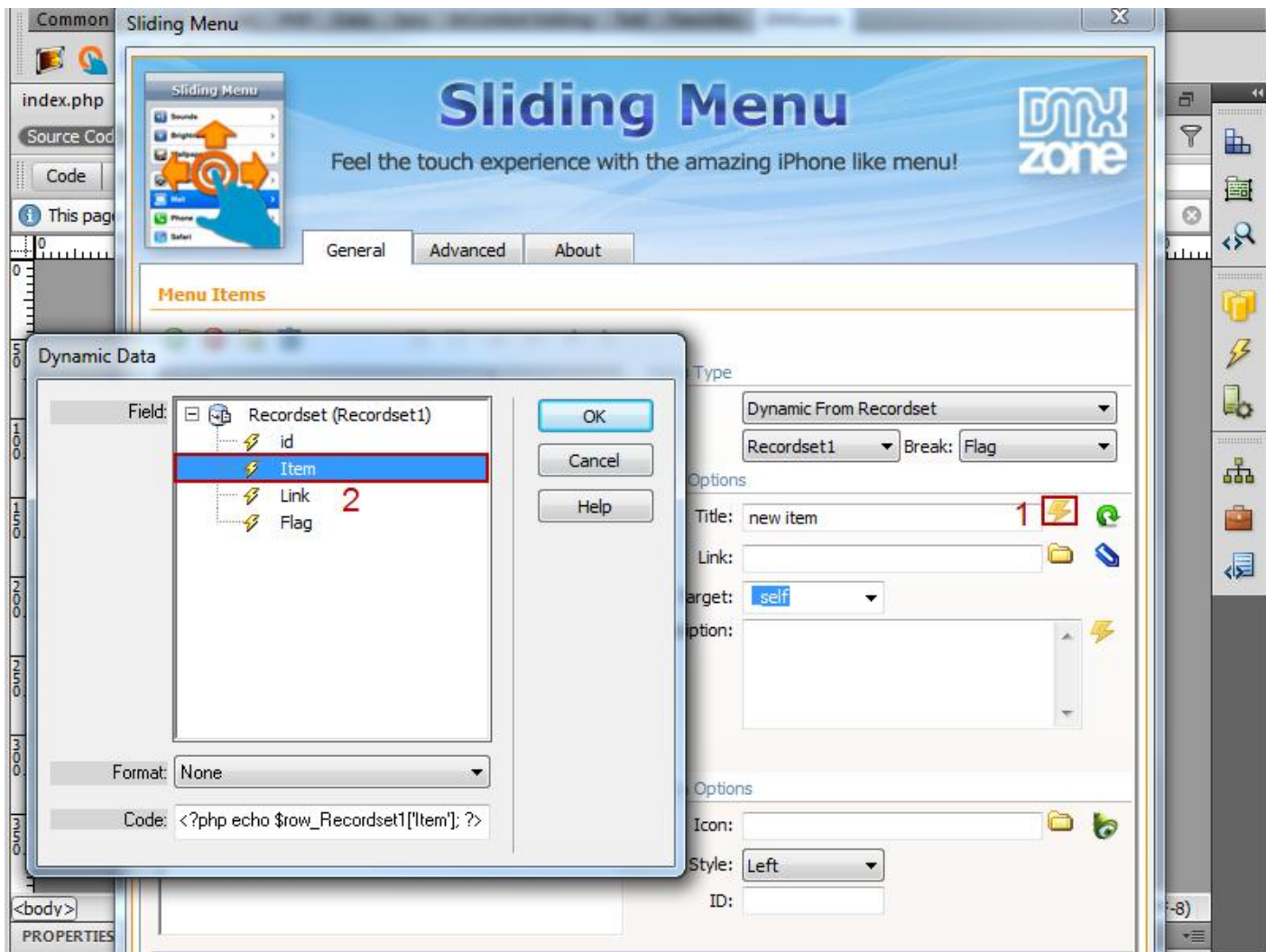

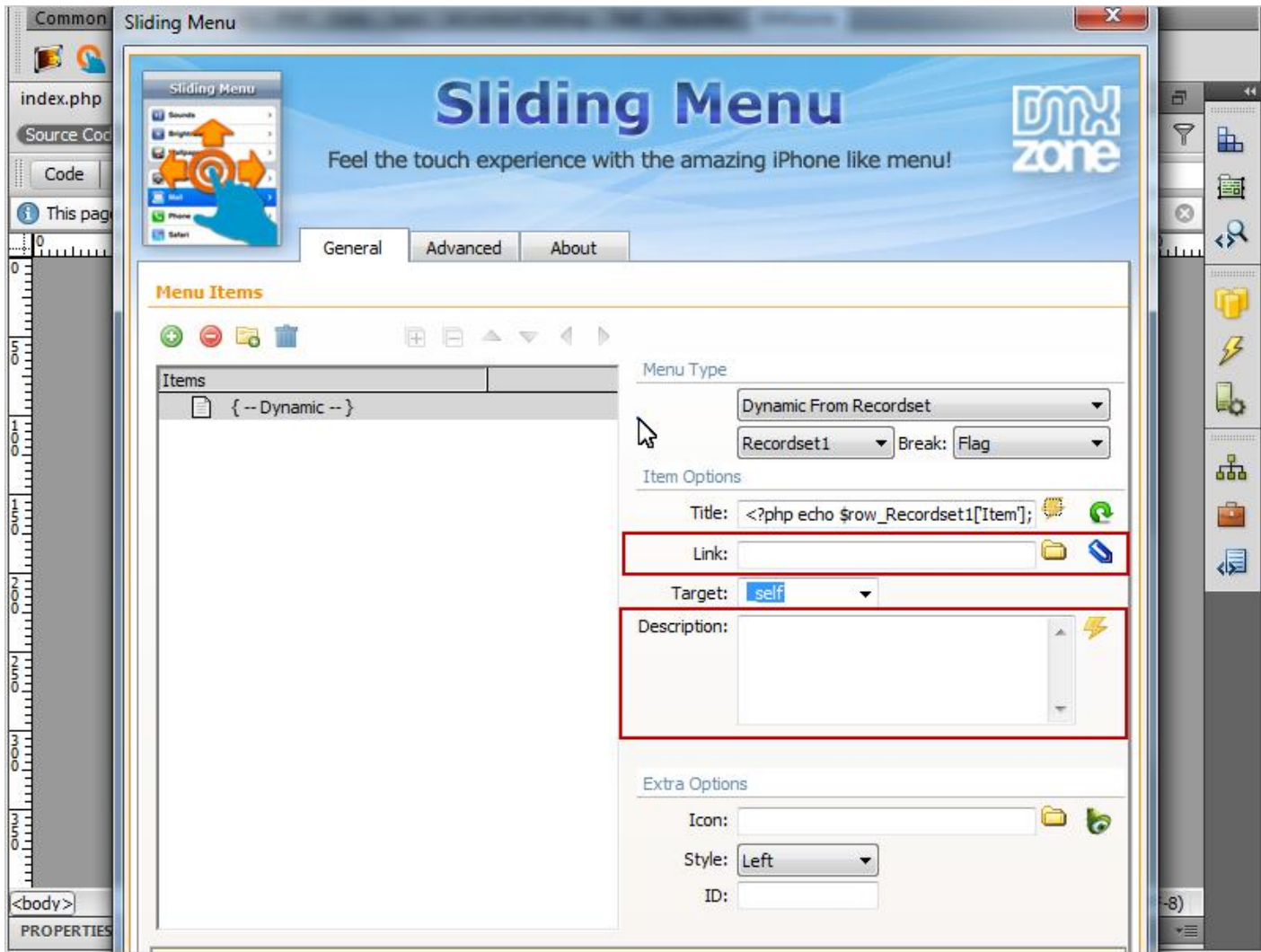
5. **Creating dynamic menu** – Select your **Recordset (1)** and select **Flag** column here, it will tell the menu how the child items are grouped (**2**).
